nation will be held tonight before the boys basketball game.

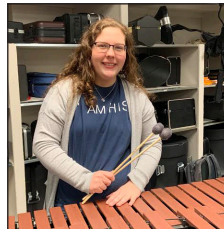

Jadyn Clark, a junior here at Field Kindley, attended State band last year. This year for the second year in a row she will get to go again! Clark is excited that this is her second year in a row making State band.

The process to making it to State is that you have to get accepted from district honor band, which was held at Pittsburg State University.

Students from all over Kansas will come together and play at State band. To qualify for State band you must make district honor band first. Everyone auditioning for district band prepares the same piece, the top three to five in each district are eligible to audition for State. Clark auditioned with about 50 mallet players for a spot at State and they only take the top four.

"The band I was selected for was the 1234A KMEA All-State band. Meaning that the band I will perform in is made up of the best musicians



from 1,2,3, and 4A schools across the state of Kansas," Clark said.

The KMEA is the Kansas Music Educators Association (whose president-elect just so happens to be our very own Mark Gard), and holds a three day long convention in Wichita every year. During these three days Clark will rehearse with the other State band members and on the last day will hold a concert. The rehearsals will start on February 27 and the performance will be on February 29, at the Century II Convention Center in Wichita.

"The anticipation leading up to finding out was more exciting than actually finding out," Clark said. "I knew that the results would be out by the Wednesday following State auditions. Last year, the results came out at 10:38 pm on Tuesday night so I told myself that I had to go to sleep at 10:45 Tuesday night or else I would go insane from lack of sleep. Ironically, the results were posted at 11:20, while I was asleep. Everyone knew before I did. Although it was a great thing to wake up to in the morning."

Clark has been in Band all three years of high school and was the drum major this fall for the FKHS marching band.
