FKHS starts Scholar's Bowl team

Last year, the FKHS scholar's bowl team went to one tournament just to try it out. This year they have a full team of students who are practicing and have started going to competitions.

Scholar's bowl is a KSHSAA sponsored activity that involves two teams of five students going head to head answering questions from different categories. There are seven different categories at each tournament, including; world language, science/health, math, fine arts, social science, year in review, and language arts. There are different rounds at every competition and there are 16 questions per round. After a question is read one student from a team will buzz in, if the answer is correct, they earn 10 points for their team. If the answer is incorrect the opposite team gets a chance to answer.

This year's team consists of nine students including juniors Brandon Decker and Alexis Ragan and seniors Kimberley Moore, Shelby

Coons, Clifford Mitchell, Julia Wright, Guadalupe Ramirez, Eli Bell and Deja Kuehn.

So far this season the team has been to two competitions, their first one was on Monday, November 4 in Oswego. In Oswego, the team came home with 295 points and represented FKHS very well.

At their second competition on Tuesday, November 12, the team went to their first varsity meet at St. Marys' Colgan and got a feel for the other varsity meets in the future.

"There was good communication between teammates, and we learned what we needed to do to improve in the future," head scholar's bowl coach Ashleigh Shields said. "One thing is to be more confident buzzing in."

The team still has several things they can improve on, but they are excited to see how the rest of the season goes.

The final two competitions for this Fall are November 19 and December 3.
