The Importance of Early Intervention Research tell us that low income children who receive high-quality

child care are...

- 55% less likely to need special education services
- 72% less likely to be arrested for drug-related offenses
- · 31% more likely to graduate high school
- · 20% more likely to be employed
- · 500% more likely to own home

Age-to-Age Kindergarten Classroom

- One Kindergarten classroom is housed in the middle of Windsor Place. Students and "grandparents" participate in activities together daily.
- Parents must fill out an application. Student are chosen through a lottery process.

Social Emotional Skills

Increased self-regulation skills
Fewer students exhibiting separation
anxiety Want to help other students
(empathy)
Compliment and encourage each other



Learning to Learn Skills

Tremendous listening skills
A love of reading (or being read to)
Understand teachers expectations
Parents of ELC children know kiddos are responsible for academics and have a heightened awareness of their role as an educational partner.
Homework is coming back with parent assistance



Communication and Literacy Skills

Enhanced literacy skills compared to peers (letter recognition and rhyming)
